6,000 Career and Tech Students Compete during SkillsUSA Conference

Louisville community benefits from students' skills and expertise.

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (June 12, 2017) — SkillsUSA National Leadership and Skills Conference, the world's largest showcase of skilled trades, returns to the Kentucky Exposition Center June 19-23. The event brings with it an estimated economic impact of \$18 million to Louisville.

More than 16,000 middle-school, high-school and college students; teachers; education leaders; and representatives from national corporations, trade associations, businesses and labor unions participate in the event.

The conference highlight is the annual SkillsUSA Championships, June 21-22. During the competition, top career and technical students participate in 100 hands-on contests, representing a wide range of technical, skilled, service and health occupations, including:

"The Kentucky Exposition Center is proud to host SkillsUSA again this year and through 2020," said Jason Rittenberry, President and CEO of Kentucky Venues. SkillsUSA community service projects include:

- Build-A-Table Event: June 21-22, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. West Wing of Kentucky Exposition Center The public is invited to help build 250 picnic tables for local nonprofit organizations: schools, public parks, playgrounds, food pantries and more.
- Blood Drive: June 22, 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Kentucky Exposition Center Parking Lot: Outdoor Trade Show The public can donate blood to the local community via the Kentucky Blood Center.
- Service Projects: June 23 Locations throughout the Louisville area. Students will share their skills and work on local projects that include: Supplies over Seas, Louisville Metro Parks, Habitat for Humanity, Youth Build, Louisville Rescue Mission and more.

SkillsUSA Championships is free and open to the public Wednesday, June 21 and Thursday, June 22 from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Parking is \$8 per car, \$20 for a bus.

The mission of SkillsUSA is to ensure a skilled workforce by preparing students for success in their chosen technical, service and health fields. Founded in 1965, the organization has served 12.5 million members, and more than 335,000 advisors and students participate each year.

One of the 10 largest facilities of its kind in the U.S., the <u>Kentucky Exposition Center</u> (KEC) features 1.2 million square feet of contiguous exhibit space, including Freedom Hall, an indoor arena that seats 13,500 people. The facility's class "A" exhibit space totals 677,000 square feet and accommodates a wide range of events year round. Conveniently located adjacent to the Louisville International Airport and near the junction of three major interstates, KEC is easily accessible and just seven minutes south of downtown Louisville.
